

WORSHIP AT HOME  
IN  
ORDINARY TIME

While public worship is suspended we will provide a liturgy to help you worship at home, and feel connected to others who are doing the same.

In the Church's Year we are now in Ordinary Time, sometimes known as the Green Season because of the liturgical colour associated with most of the Sundays. Ordinary Time begins after the Feast of Pentecost and lasts until Advent (with some festivals and holy days along the way).

Please keep this order of service for use throughout the season.

Each week, in preparation for Sunday, you will find the readings and music on the church website and on Facebook and it will be sent via the parish email news (you can subscribe to this by sending an email to [parishoffice.headington@gmail.com](mailto:parishoffice.headington@gmail.com)) Please feel free to use the musical suggestions as you wish in the service. Where it says **Hymn** is only a suggestion.

Even in this time when we cannot gather to celebrate this service in church together, we believe that Christ is with us in his Word, drawing us together by his Spirit as one before God. Choose a space in your home which is peaceful and create your own worship space. A candle, a cross, a bible or some flowers can help to make the space feel special.

If you are worshipping with someone else in your household think about how you will share out the elements of the service. For example, where there are numbered verses you might say them by alternate verse.

You will find some options for intercessions at the back of the booklet but feel free to use silence as well. Sometimes you might also like to try a version of the Lord's Prayer that you are less familiar with!
